






What is School-to-Prison Pipeline? A social phenomenon where students become formally involved with the criminal justice system as a result of school policies that use law enforcement, rather than discipline, to address behavioral problems and push youth out of school.




- Personal biases of instructional staff
- Instructional staff lack cultural competence
- The use of zero-tolerance policies that mandate exclusionary punishments
- The presence of School Resource Officers on school campuses





The Impact of Zero-Tolerance Policies

Data and research are clear on this point: children of color, to include those with disabilities face high, disparate rates of exclusionary discipline.



What Can PTAs Do To Improve Black Students (w/disabilities, LGBTQ) Outcomes?

- Acknowledge that Black children are being pushed out of school due to harsher disciplinary consequences than their White peers
- Be intentional about reviewing your school site's discipline data
- Be willing to initiate courageous conversations surrounding the disproportionate number of Black students being suspended/change of placement
- Offer a variety of ongoing educational opportunities, such as workshops, panel discussions, and instructional activities about School-to-Prison Pipeline
- Cultivate a discipline committee to undermine the systemic
 School-to-Prison Pipeline
